Service and Volunteer Coordinator for Glover Park Village

Glover Park Village is seeking a part-time, paid contractor to manage services for our members and also coordinate our volunteers for approximately 10-20 hours per week.

Through our volunteer network, our organization provides free services such as home maintenance and organization, gardening, transportation, medical appointment escorting, telephone check-ins, and social visits which enables our members to age well in our community. Our mission is to help older people stay

in their homes in the Greater Glover Park area while mitigating the effects of social isolation.

As Service Coordinator you will create new requests in our Helpful Village portal, make sure requests are being matched with a volunteer, maintain the member database, do outreach to our members both in person and by phone, and onboard new members.

As Volunteer Coordinator you will meet with and on-board new volunteers, maintain the volunteer database, and match volunteers with open service requests.

While this position can be done largely remotely and offers a flexible schedule, we would prefer the coordinator be local or fairly close to Glover Park in order to meet with Volunteers, Members, and frequently attend in-person events. The Service and Volunteer Coordinator is an integral role in our small but mighty non-profit. Are you friendly, patient, and outgoing? Join us!

Participate in a Study on Language in the Aging Brain at Georgetown University

Now - December 31, 2023

The Brain and Language Lab (<u>brainlang,georgetown.edu</u>) at Georgetown University's Department of Neuroscience is seeking participants for a study of language in aging. This exciting study, which is funded by the National Science Foundation, is likely to help us understand which parts of the brain are responsible for those senior moments when you can't remember a word or someone's name.

Participants should be aged 70 or older, and right-handed native speakers of English. Anyone, whether or not you think you have memory problems, is welcome. However, you should not have been diagnosed with any neurological, learning, or psychiatric disorders.

The study takes place over three sessions at Georgetown University. In the first two sessions you will be given computer-based tasks in which you have to name pictures, remember what's shown on the screen, and the like. The third session involves an optional 30-minute non-invasive MRI brain scan.

You will be paid about **\$100** for participating in the study. You can also get a picture of your scanned brain.

Do you have a sunny spot in your yard, your balcony or even your alley that you would like to see filled with beautiful plants native to DC? You now have the

chance to receive free plants and some help with planting them from DCNatives.org.

I have added a new pollinator garden at my house on Fulton Street in Glover Park planted by Thorne Rankin and her DC Natives volunteers. I have been assigned to be a Block Captain to spread the word about this extraordinary program!

Since the fall of 2022, DC Natives has planted more than 60 pollinator gardens all around DC in tree boxes, alleyways, cemeteries, yards, and balconies—indeed anywhere there is a bit of sun. Butterflies, bees, and birds are beginning to notice.

In his recent book, Nature's Best Hope, Douglas Tallamy outlines his vision for a grassroots approach to conservation. He shows how homeowners everywhere can help preserve our wildlife. Throughout the world, people are striving to build conservation corridors. But in the end, much of it comes down to the initiative of private individuals in neighborhoods—that's you and me.

Let's grow the number of Glover Park area pollinator gardens on the map at Our Projects on the DC Natives website. And maybe you can also volunteer to help plant more in and around DC. The fall program is just beginning, so sign up today.
